

Park Rules

- Protect our prairies by **always walking on paved, mown or mulched paths**.
- For the safety of our wildlife, park guests and your pet, **always keep dogs on a leash and clean up after them**. Bags for cleanup can be found at the North and South entrances to the park.
- Prevent fire damage to turf and prairies by **leaving your grills at home**. Both gas and charcoal grills are prohibited.
- Keep our park beautiful by **disposing of your garbage**—preferably by taking it with you when you leave—or by placing it in one of the garbage cans at either entrance.
- Stay safe by **not swimming**. Pebble beach has no lifeguard and strong currents exist.
- Bicyclists can be safe and kind by verbally **alerting others that they are passing on the left**.
- Keep a safe speed. **Motorized vehicles including segways, hoverboards and electric scooters are prohibited** (except for ADA mobility devices and maintenance/security vehicles).
- Keep them wild! **Please do not feed our wildlife**. Bread is very harmful to birds' digestion.
- Stay alert. Due to the vast open water, **alcohol consumption is prohibited in the park**.

Lakeshore State Park Marina



Welcome to Lakeshore State Park Marina, Milwaukee's premier moorage location. In the heart of downtown Milwaukee, the Park is adjacent to the Henry W. Maier Festival Grounds and Discovery World at Pier Wisconsin. Lakeshore State Park is an urban oasis, hosting native Wisconsin wildlife as well as providing a welcoming stopover for migratory birds. With multiple fishing areas, the park provides access to quiet waters as well as Lake Michigan and the Milwaukee River Harbor. Its accessible paved trails link to Milwaukee's other lakefront parks, the Oak Leaf Trail and the Hank Aaron State Trail. With 20 reservable boat slips, the marina can moor boats up to 60 feet long.



Procedures

Overnight and Daily Moorage Fees and Procedures for Transient Vessels Policy

- The overnight moorage fees are \$1.50 per foot, \$30 minimum. Fees include electricity.
- Watercraft that are the property of the United States, State of Wisconsin, City and County of Milwaukee are exempt from moorage fees.
- The daytime temporary moorage rate shall be \$3 an hour, \$9 minimum and applies to all watercraft tied to the dock. The park superintendent or his/her designee shall have discretion in determining the temporary moorage time schedules based on transient boat traffic demand levels. No reservations will be taken for daytime mooring.

Doubling / Rafting

- When two boats are moored in a slip, the second boat will not be provided with power; however, the second boater may make arrangements with the first boater to share power and water service if they so desire. Full rates apply to both boats.
- The first boater in a doubled slip is under no obligation to share power.
- Vessels that are rafted onto properly moored vessels shall be charged the normal dockage rate.
- The rafted boater may make arrangements with the rightful moored boater to share power but the rightful moored boater is under no obligation to do so.



Reservations

Overnight Reservations

- Fees are based on the overall length of the vessel as shown on your boat registration.
- Slips are available May 15 through October 31
- Reservations may be made up to 11 months in advance.
- Length of stay is limited to 4 days. (The boat must leave for a minimum of 24 hours before renting again).
- The overnight mooring fee is for a period beginning when the slip becomes occupied at 3 p.m. (earlier if available) through 1 p.m. of the next day.
- An overnight transient boater who wishes to occupy the slip beyond 1 p.m., if available, shall be allowed to extend the time at the discretion of the superintendent or his/her designee by paying \$3/hour (\$9 minimum) for daytime temporary moorage.
- Any boat moored overnight directly to a pier dock shall be charged the full fee even if utilities are not used.
- Check in begins at 3 p.m. If the boater's site is vacant before 3 p.m., the boater may occupy the site.

Daytime Moorage

- No daily/hourly reservations are possible – first-come, first-served if space is available.
- If a slip becomes reserved for overnight, the hourly user may be asked to leave or move to an available slip.
- Same-day overnight reservations are available and can be made 24/7 online at <https://wisconsin.goingtocamp.com> or calling the reservation call center 1-888-947-2757 (1-888-WI-PARKS).

Marina Rules

- No swimming or fishing off docks or piers.
- No open flames/grilling allowed on docks or piers.
- Dogs must be leashed (no longer than 8 feet) at all times. Pet owners must pick up after their pets.
- Quiet time is 11 p.m. to 7 a.m. (Except the nights of festivals, when quiet time starts at 12:30 a.m.)
- The park closes at 10 p.m. to all but the boat owners and guests, fisherpersons and trail users.
- Boater's guests may not exceed the boat's capacity.
- All boats tied up to slips will pay the appropriate fees.
- All boat owners and guests must remain on their boat and/or adjoining slip during all fireworks events from 9 p.m. until finale.
- Park is closed to traffic between 9 p.m. and the end of the fireworks display.
- You are responsible for the safety of your vessel.
